Message from the President

We are grateful for your moral and financial support which has enabled several impressive accomplishments in 2015.

Science meeting. The TMJ Association published and distributed *TMJ Science*, which includes the summary and recommendations from our 7th scientific meeting. This publication is also available on our website, www.tmj.org. We hope you're impressed with how far the science of Temporomandibular Disorders (TMD) has come.



Tissue engineering and regenerative research. Among the NIH initiatives addressing TMD is one important to patients who need jaw implants. In September, the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research funded planning grants totaling more than \$2 million for projects aimed at establishing resource centers for the development of tissue engineering and regenerative medicine. This initiative is in addition to one on the *Biology of the Temporomandibular Joint in Health and Disease*.

Expanding the field. This year The TMJ Association launched the **Chronic Pain Research Alliance** (CPRA) initiative. This initiative evolved from research showing that TMD often overlaps with other chronic pain conditions, suggesting common underlying biological mechanisms. The CPRA initiative is important because these other pain conditions are treated by a range of specialists in the medical community. By connecting TMD with these conditions, medical professionals will become educated about TMD and the complexity of these disorders. TMD's inclusion in additional research studies will expand the base of scientific expertise on the condition and lead to new treatment options, not only for TMD, but also for the comorbid conditions. We're proud to have Christin Veasley, a long-term health research advocate, lead this effort.

Informational guides. To address the oral disability which affects the dietary choices of TMD patients, in March we published *TMD*, *Nutrition and You*, a guide to help maintain healthy nutrition. We also published *Temporomandibular Disorders*, *Dental Care and You*, which provides suggestions for oral hygiene self-care and ways to make dental appointments as painless as possible.

We will continue our advocacy, information dissemination, patient support, and education efforts on TMD and those conditions that coexist with TMD.
